

WHERE IT HAPPENS

The conference is hosted by the Northshore Harbor Center in Slidell, Louisiana, just a 30 minute drive from New Orleans with access from both the New Orleans and the Gulfport-Biloxi International Airports. Quality lodging with special conference rates are available.

WHAT IT'S ALL ABOUT

The 2018 Gulf Coast Elder Abuse Conference will continue the history of excellence in providing training for licensed professionals, other care providers and law enforcement personnel. The brightest, most articulate and highly skilled presenters will deliver compelling information on a variety of topics that relate to variety of different issues that constitute Elder Abuse.

The 12th annual event will continue to expand on the growth seen in the last several years. The 2017 conference hosted almost 200 registrants from twenty states, all of whom were seeking an opportunity to learn new and different information in a dynamic setting.

CONTINUING EDUCATION*

Nationally approved continuing education credits will be offered for several professions, including social workers, counselors, nurses, certified case managers and bankers; Louisiana approved credit will be offered for attorneys and physical therapists. Submissions for Continuing Education credit are underway for the following organizations: NBCC, NASW, ABA-IBC, AOTA, CCMC, La PT Board, La Bar Association. This activity is being jointly provided by the St. Tammany SALT Council and the International Association of Forensic Nurses. The International Association of Forensic Nurses is accredited as a provider of continuing nursing education by the American Nurses Credentialing Center's Commission on Accreditation. Continuing nursing education credits have been applied for.



AT THE CONFERENCE*

For two days there will be four classrooms in use, each offering six one-hour classes. This structure offers a total of 48 class hours during the conference with a class schedule that will offer 32-36 different classes. Some classes from the first day will be repeated on the second day to give the maximum opportunity to schedule the classes sought by the student. Each attendee will have the opportunity to receive six hours of training daily. Basic classes will be offered for first-time conference participants, expansion on previously taught subjects will give returning attendees a chance to learn more advanced information, and new topics will be introduced. Regardless of background and experience, there will be classes beneficial to anyone who is committed to addressing the needs of actual and potential victims of Elder Abuse.
